

The corps was broken up in May, 1865. Major-genbral Philip Henry Sheridan (U. S. M. A. 1853) was born in Albany. New York, March 6, 1831. After service in the West he became captain in May, 1861. He was on the staff of Halleck at Corinth, and in May, 1862, was made colonel of the Second Michigan Cavalry. Defeating Forrests and repulsing Chalmers superior force at Booneville, he was made brigadiergeneral of volunteers. In August, he defeated Falkner...
