Stainrook answered the call and served as captain for the full term in the 22d Regiment, and immediately upon his return to Philadelphia offered his services for three years or during the war. His services were accepted, he was commissioned as colonel, and authorized to raise the 109th Regiment Pennsylvania Infantry Volunteers - Curtin Light Guards so called in honor of the patriotic and gallant War Governor of Pennsylvania. December 20, 1861, the regiment was mustered into the United States service, and from then until May 9, 1862, was drilled and disciplined for the field, and on this date received marching orders, arriving in Washington May 10, 1862. From this date until May 24, 1862, continued drilling, and discipline was maintained; and when the officer detailed by the War Department to inspect the troops encamped around Washington, for the...
